## Report on WFTL Activity Wednesday, March 26, 2015

The day revolved around two main activities with the first beginning at the WSF site at 8:30 am. This was to support and participate in the workshop carried out by the Network of Liberation Theologians Germany and Baraka, a good team of young thinkers coming principally from Germany and France who are Christian and a Muslim Tunisian philosopher. This workshop was designed in such a way that the speakers began with a very short exposition of the principles of Liberation Theology then participants discussed the link between Liberation Theology and political engagement in small groups (according to language) and afterwards came together in plenary sessions. This process was repeated to address European migration problematics and the contribution Liberation Theology should make in terms of practical activities to overcoming this problematic. As it started, it also ended with a moment of prayer. Participants expressed their satisfaction with the activity and some interesting contacts for the dialogue between Christian and Muslim Liberation Theologies were forged. This activity was included in the WSF schedule thanks to the generosity of the WFTL who had reserved one workshop more than the three needed. The Network of Liberation Theologians Germany and Baraka were able to take advantage of this after we collaborated with them on Monday at our first meeting in Tunis. After the break established by the timetable, we began the workshop on *Indigenous Peoples, Religions and Dignity*. Three presentations were made: Luiz Carlos Susin, *The Call of Dignity*, Gerald Boodoo, *Liberation and Indigenous*
